From the Editor & Parish Clerk

Good morning. It's not quite as sunny yet today, but I do hope that you've been enjoying the slightly warmer weather!

The Parish Council has now appointed a Chair - thank you Cllr Nicholls for taking on the baton. We also have a Vice Chair in the wings, waiting to accept office at the next meeting, so hopefully we can soon get back up to speed. It's been notably *different* having lost a some key Cllrs and not having anybody in the Chair or Vice Chair position, but I'm looking forward to a new chapter. If you'd like to join the team we still have spaces for new folk to get involved. You don't need experience, just enthusiasm - Cllr training is available.

The Parish Council have instructed a contractor to sort out our overgrown verges and untidy pavements. We're just waiting for the approval from SCC. Hopefully we will see some action soon. The Lark Valley Path repairs were finally scheduled in for March, and there has been signs of work, so I'm hoping that's been completed. Council also discussed having an extra cut each year to help keep the path more passable, as it does tend to get quite overgrown with nettles.

I'd like to just say that I've noticed a few residents have done a great job of tidying up the pavements outside their properties - notably Golton Cottages and Gaughton House. THANK YOU! There will be others (apologies), but these are the ones I have seen. I'm in the process of doing along the front of mine too, and it does make a difference when we take care of where we live - it is noticed. If we can all cut back overhanging bushes, trim our trees etc. and help keep our pavements clear it will make a huge difference. The sad reality is that WSC and SCC have had to reduce budget on a lot of these services and our villages are looking a little 'shabby' because of it.

The village volunteering group will be out again soon though, tidying up and tackling small projects that they can work on safely - if you'd like to get involved, please get in touch.

We've recently had City Fibre and their contractors tear through the village, sadly leaving behind a bit of a mess in places. I have just met with a representative from City Fibre to share my disappointment and he left to go and take a look around. Can I ask, if you have any concerns over works carried out near you, to send me an email and some pictures and I'll collate and pass them on. I've already noted, the village green, the new comms box on the pavement opposite the church, the bus stop area by the Pound Meadow bus stop and Chestnut Close.

In other news, its great to have the 3 Kings back open and we wish the new team all the best. Well done for the fantastic new fenced area out the front - I'm certainly looking forward to a nice summer evening drink in that spot. Sadly though the Fish & Chip van at the community centre hasn't been as well supported as hoped, despite extensive advertising. I think the plan is for them to go to once a month, so keep an eye out on their website and Facebook page for dates.

Lastly, there have been a few folk in the village looking to organise some village events. Would anybody else be willing to join the team and support them? If you have an interest in bringing the community together, please get in touch.

Approved Minutes from Parish Council Meeting

Tuesday 18th February, 2025, 18:30, Fornham All Saints
Community Centre

*These draft minutes were approved at the Parish Council Meeting on
18th March, 2025.*

Present:

Cllr Richard Nicholls (RN) (Acting Chair), Cllrs Don Lynch (DL), Mat Stewart (MS) and Derek Brown (DB).

Clerk Justin Hook (JH), 2 representatives from All Saints Hotel (AS) and 1 member of the public.

Agenda Items

1. Chairman's welcome, opening remarks and to receive apologies for absence
The chair opened the meeting and welcomed all those in attendance. Apologies received and accepted from Cllr Surman, County Cllr Rebecca Hopfensperger and District Cllr Sarah Broughton.
2. (i) To receive members Declarations of Interests - **none received.**
(ii) Council to consider any new written requests for dispensation and/or requests which have been received - **none received.**
3. To approve adopt the minutes from the Council meeting held on the 21st January 2025
Council resolved to approve and adopt the minutes, the Chairman signed them.
4. To receive County Councillor's report from Cllr. Rebecca Hopfensperger
No report received. No updates received to questions raised.

5. To receive Borough Councillor's reports from Cllr. Sarah Broughton and Cllr Rebecca Hopfensperger

No report received. No updates received to questions raised.

6. Public open session up to 15 minutes - questions and issues on matters arising from the agenda and from the village

Resident raised concern that parking outside Lucy's is getting worse.

DB confirmed that this was discussed at the last meeting, but that a decision was made to take no further action, as unless the pavement is blocked, little can be done to enforce.

ACTION: JH to liaise with RH to confirm what, if anything can be done.

Resident raised concern that the view of the golf course was significantly void of trees, following the removal of the poplar trees, the clearing of the ditch and removal of trees across the site.

AS confirmed that a schedule of works is being completed to replant trees across the site.

Council confirmed that the replanting of the poplar trees had been completed in line with the Forestry Commission felling licenses.

7. To receive reports from Councillors:

- a. Traffic / Roads / VASs / Road Signs - Don Lynch

Nothing to report. New VAS equipment and solar units to be installed before end of March. RN requested new battery for Larks Gate unit.

ACTION: JH to investigate.

ACTION: JH to request updates on 30mph roundels from RH.

- b. Volunteering - Derek Brown

Volunteering scheduled to start again from April.

JH requested the staking of the wobbly fences on Lark Valley Path be added to the schedule of works.

- c. Facilities / Assets Management / Community Centre / EV - Derek Brown

No further updates. Community Centre not going ahead with slow EV chargers.

AS advised that their EV chargers were currently being installed and will be available for public use.

- d. Local Businesses & Residents / Lark Valley - Richard Nicholls

Planned works to the Lark Valley Path now scheduled from early March - no exact dates as yet. The path will be closed whilst works carried out.

- e. Social Issues / Village Voice - Clerk

ACTION: JH to make contact with Thingoe Lodge.

- f. Marham Park / Highways / Village Hall / Anglian Water (AW) / River Lark - Mat Stewart

Parking becoming an issue directly outside the David Lloyd gym, where patrons are parking on the road and not using the car park. Needs double yellows to allow enforcement, but unadopted as yet.

Awaiting AW to advise next meeting date.

ACTION: MS to request data from AW monitoring devices in the river.

- g. Allotments / Emergency Plan - David Surman

All 2025 invoices have been issued and all plot holders have been re-contracted. One vacant plot. 3 on waiting list.

8. To receive Clerks report

The banking switch to Lloyds is underway.

Following the conversation at the last meeting regarding golfers insurance, the Clerk confirmed that AS had provided evidence of signage on the course and information on the score cards regarding the requirement for player's insurance.

ACTION: JH still to investigate first responders in the village.

Introduction to CiLCA (Certificate in Local Council Administration) training session attended. First session is in April and Clerk will attend, with cost being shared with Clerks other clerking role, as agreed and budgeted for.

JH - Planning advised delays due to concerns over Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG) metric, considering new hotel wing planting, plus awaiting response from Highways.

Planning application - partial change of use of golf
course to site six timber pods

*Portal says decision pending. BUT it is being
reported that it has been approved???*

JH - Planning advised this was decided at the
December meeting of Delegation Panel, but that they
had to wait on an agreement for BNG monitoring.
There was no issue with the portal.

Car Park Heath Farm Business Centre Tut Hill
Fornham All Saints Suffolk

Planning application - a. use of existing car park as
driver training facility b. retention of temporary storage
containers as classroom and storage area, c. use of
existing agricultural access and retention of access
track in association with driver training facility

*Application withdrawn. Clerk following up with
planners re: site still in use.*

JH - Planning advised a new application had since
been received and that consultation details would be
provided shortly.

11. Skate & play park inspections

Council noted from report that remedial work required, but all low to very low risk.

Replacement parts to be fitted when warmer weather arrives. Some drilling of parts required. DB to obtain help with this.

Some future attention required to fencing and gate. Gate closing at 1.5 seconds, which is 2.5 seconds faster than the recommended 4 seconds.

12. Overgrown pavements

Since last meeting, a third quote has been received for this work. At £685 it is considerably cheaper, but unfortunately the contractor doesn't have the necessary licenses to complete the works so close to the highway. Clerk checked with SCC, who advised chosen contractor must have an NRSWA accreditation.

Council resolved to complete these works going with the middle quote of £3,875 +Vat, assuming they have the necessary licenses to work on the highways.

JH reported overhanging trees on B1106 near to AW entrance again vis highways reporting tool. Awaiting response.

13. Grass cutting

WSC have quoted £165.73 per cut. The Clerk has received a second quote of £125 per cut (plus £25 for the area at the top of Pigeon Lane). Awaiting a third quote.

14. Community event

Council to discuss the letter received from the Village Hall representative

Council recognised an apathy from members and residents, putting it down to a sign of the times, and busy lives and schedules.

Council resolved to propose a collaborative approach, working with the Village Hall, Community Centre and other interested parties.

ACTION: JH to reach out to interested parties with the aim of arranging a meeting before the end of April to put forward ideas and discuss a village event.

15. Updated Financial Regulations

The Clerk has worked with the Locum Clerk to update the Financial Regulations, but now time is required to review and confirm finer detail before Council can adopt.

Council resolved to delay the adoption of revised Financial Regulations, to allow time to recruit a Chair and Vice Chair, and giving them time to settle into their new roles.

16. Overhaul of policies and procedures

The Locum Clerk has completed works to update a large catalogue of policies and procedures. Now time is required to review and fully understand each document before Council can adopt.

Council resolved to delay the adoption of updated policies and procedures, to allow time to recruit a Chair and Vice Chair, and giving them time to settle into their new roles.

18. Councillor recruitment

The Clerk had spoken to an interested party that DL had put forward, but unfortunately work commitments might make joining difficult. DL reminded Council that attendance is not required at every meeting.

19. Update on Chair & Vice Chair positions

RN agreed that he would stand as Chair for a period of 6 months if somebody was willing to take on the role of Vice Chair. DB agreed to take on the role of Vice Chair for a period of 6 months. Both roles to be elected at the March meeting.

Draft Minutes from Parish Council Meeting

Tuesday 18th March, 2025, 18:30, Fornham All Saints Community Centre

These draft minutes will be approved at the Parish Council Meeting on 15th April, 2025.

Present:

Cllr Richard Nicholls (RN) (Chair), Cllrs Mat Stewart (MS) and David Surman (DS).

Clerk Justin Hook (JH), 2 representatives from All Saints Resort (AS) and 8 members of the public.

Agenda Items

1. Council to elect Chairman
Cllrs Nicholls was nominated for the role of Chairman. No other nominations received.
Council resolved to elect Cllr Nicholls as Chairman.
2. Council to elect Vice Chairman
Cllr Brown has shown an interest in being elected as Vice Chair, but in his absence Council will postpone election of Vice Chair to the April meeting.
3. Signing of Declaration of Acceptance of Office and issue of Register of Interests
The new Chairman and the Clerk signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.
4. Chairman's welcome, opening remarks and to receive apologies for absence
The Chairman welcomed all attendees to the meeting. Apologies for absence received and accepted from Cllr Brown, Cllr Lynch, County Cllr Rebecca Hopfensperger and District Cllr Sarah Broughton.
5. (i) To receive members Declarations of Interests - **none**

received.

(ii) Council to consider any new written requests for dispensation and/or requests which have been received - **none received.**

6. To approve & adopt the minutes from the Council meeting held on 18th February 2025

Council resolved to approve and adopt the minutes, the Chairman signed them.

7. To receive County Councillor's report from Cllr. Rebecca Hopfensperger

None received.

8. To receive Borough Councillor's reports from Cllr. Sarah Broughton and Cllr Rebecca Hopfensperger

None received.

The Clerk noted his disappointment that neither Cllr Hopfensperger nor Cllr Broughton had responded to requests for updates or a report for the meeting.

ACTION: Clerk to try and arrange a meeting with both to discuss.

9. Public open session up to 15 minutes - questions and issues on matters arising from the agenda and from the village

- i. Resident raised the question of a VE Day 80 celebration on The Green.

This item is to be covered later in the agenda under item 19.

- ii. Resident raised concerns regarding the state of grounds following on from the installation of fibre throughout the village. In particular an area in Pound Meadow and the section of The Green from the bus stop to the church. Both have had the grass dug up and not replaced satisfactorily, with stones on the surface and no grass seed. Concerns that mowers will flick up the stones and cause injury to people or damage to property.

Council also highlighted issues with uneven, poorly fitted manholes and the addition of a service box in the

pavement at the end of The Green.

ACTION: Clerk to speak to City Fibre to understand process for complaints.

ACTION: Clerk to include article in Village Voice asking residents to report any issues that they notice to the Clerk.

The area outside of the cemetery was also highlighted and parts of Chestnut Close.

- iii. Stuart Turner from the Health Hub at All Saints Resort shared that following previous discussions and the PC meeting in Fornham St Martin / St Genevieve, they had resubmitted plans for the proposed pickleball and tennis courts, removing the pickleball element and taking into consideration other comments and suggestions that had been made.

This item is to be covered later in the agenda under item 12i.

10. To receive reports from Councillors:

- a. Traffic / Roads / VASs / Road Signs - Don Lynch
Plan in place to install new VAS equipment by the end of April. Nothing further to report.
- b. Volunteering - Derek Brown
Scheduled to start again April. Nothing further to report.
- c. Facilities / Assets Management / Community Centre / EV - Derek Brown
Nothing to report.
- d. Local Businesses & Residents / Lark Valley - Richard Nicholls
Repair works to the Lark Valley Path were scheduled before Christmas and now planned for March. It seems that work has begun downstream of Duck Sluice Farm and the Fornham section looking likely to begin next week.
- e. Social Issues / Village Voice - Clerk

Clerk has made contact with Thingoe Lodge, introducing himself in case any issues arise, now that former Cllr Mayhew is no longer the point of contact. Village Voice advertising monies mostly collected, 3 new full page ads acquired. A suggestion was made to speak to the new pub owners as a potential advertiser.

- f. Marham Park / Highways / Village Hall / Anglian Water (Lark) - Mat Stewart

Ongoing parking issues at David Lloyd, but roads still unadopted so little can be actioned. Technically Marham Park is not under the FAS remit, but there is still monies in the development pot to complete a section of path from the top of Tut Hill to the country park. Cllr Stewart still applying pressure to get that in place.

Anglian Water spillages data for 2024 appears muddled and not complete.

ACTION: MS to challenge the data.

- g. Allotments / Emergency Plan - David Surman
Recent issue with a plot holder having a fire, but otherwise all good.

Contact made with previous compiler of the emergency plan.

11. To receive Clerks report

Banking update: Lloyds application was refused at the last minute as completed online (as advised) and not in paper form.

ACTION: Clerk to resubmit again in the future.

However Council to advise planners of the concerns raised by other businesses on site - noise, lighting, parking in the lay-by, unsightly portaloo, odours, cars dumped on site, potential storage of hazardous materials.

Clerk updated that the contractor had been appointed and the necessary forms for Highways approval had been completed and sent to the contractor.

ACTION: Clerk to follow up.

16. Grass cutting

WSC have quoted £165.73 per cut. The Clerk has received a second quote of £125 per cut (plus £25 for the area at the top of Pigeon Lane) and a third quote from RG Landscapes (recommended by All Saints Resort) of £80 per cut.

Council resolved to appoint RG Landscapes to cut the grass in the churchyard.

The Clerk noted that some residents had taken to tidying the pavements outside their own properties, in particular Golton Cottages and Gaughton House.

It was suggested to make a comment of thanks in the Village Voice.

It was also suggested to celebrate and thank some of the other new ventures in the village; the new owners of the Three Kings for the works to improve the front garden area, making it much safer and more pleasant to sit at, and the new mobile fish & chip van at the community centre.

17. Devolution Consultation

Council to consider what is required in terms of it's involvement or response.

The Chairman and Clerk are to attend the SALC West Suffolk Forum on Devolution on the 25th March, and will report back following this.

18. Local Plan Consultation

Cllrs to individually review paperwork to determine if any changes impact Fornham All Saints and report back any findings.

19. Community event

Council originally suggested that the event be held at the community centre for health and safety reasons. The planning meeting was poorly attended and the original organiser stepped down. A new group of residents propose an event to be held on The Green with a picnic, and music, potentially a beacon, to celebrate VE Day 80 on Monday 5th May.

Council still remain concerned that The Green is not the safest place in the village to hold an event and that just because it happened many times in the past, doesn't alleviate current concerns.

Organisers stated it would be covered under the village halls insurance policy.

Council requested organisers to create a full management plan, with detailed proposal, itinerary, and risk assessments, for consideration by Council at the April meeting.

20. Donations to community groups - S137 monies

Council to discuss requests for donation from WI and St Edmundsbury Newstalk.

Clerk advised that of the £2000 budget for donations in 2024/25, only £250 had been gifted so far to the WI. Council to consider WI request in the new 2025/26 financial year.

Council opted not to donate to St Edmundsbury Newstalk, but did favour the ideas of SARS (Suffolk Accident Rescue Service) and the Air Ambulance charities.

ACTION: Clerk to investigate.

Resident asked if funding might be available or the Bury Water Meadows Group for litter picking equipment and a trolley. Resident was asked to submit a request to the Clerk for consideration by Council.

21. VAS locations in the village

Council to determine where the officially licensed VAS sites are in the village and best use of equipment

ACTION: Clerk to investigate.

Council to consider applying to make the Larks Gate VAS an officially licensed site

ACTION: Chairman and Clerk to go through paperwork and apply.

Church Visitors Throughout the year, there are always many and varied visitors to our lovely church. Some may come to remember a wedding from years ago, some to visit the church where a relation worshipped.

Two visitors who recently came had musical connections with the church: Anne Brewins now Anne Roberts, daughter of Leslie Brewins, the organist at FAS in the 1980s. She now lives in Guildford, Surrey and she commented how lovely the church looked in preparation for Remembrance Day. There was also a visit by Chloe Balaam, perhaps related to Muriel Balaam, a church organist in the Fornhams and a musical connection with the town.

Visitors also come from further afield: A couple came from Denmark and said how beautiful and peaceful the church is. Luke Wyatt came all the way from Albuquerque in New Mexico: he simply said how good to see the church open so he could say his morning prayers.

In the last month, I have met and enjoyed lovely chats with two visitors. The first was Robert Downing, not on his first visit as he was found in the North Transept completing a brass rubbing on the wall (photo below). He showed me some of his work and the books he is busy working on. He has one more rubbing to complete his set from FAS. A man with many talents and interests, a retired architect consultant and still with a real interest in old buildings and archaeology.



My second visitor just a few days ago was James Markwell, a young man from Market Harborough in Leicester, formerly from Ealing. He was working in the area but was on a mission to find out more about this church. For those



of you who know the churchyard may recognise the surname Markwell. James has been researching his ancestors and collects information to share with his grandfather. He knew there were graves in our churchyard, and it didn't take us long to find them. Three at the south end of the church:

John Markwell died 1815, aged 44. John Markwell died 1852, aged 59. These two graves are close to the tower and are easily visible. The third Markwell grave was Fanny Markwell married to John Smith, dates not too sure but not too far from the two Johns. James set about going through all the many interesting features of the church and was still there two hours later!

So thank you to those who keep the church open, but the band of openers is decreasing and we really could use anyone from the village who might be willing to open and close the church for a week at a time. The benefits of an open church are all there in the visitors' book. Please do get in touch with any member of the PCC for further information.

Easter Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme in West Suffolk

What is HAF and who is it for? HAF is a national programme funded by the Department for Education and coordinated locally by West Suffolk Council on behalf of Suffolk County Council.

It is primarily targeted at children or young people who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals. Activities are free and sessions include a healthy meal and snacks. Eligible families should have already received information through their school about HAF in their area.

There are also free places available to families with children or young people who don't receive benefits-related free school meals but who are struggling with the cost-of-living and suffering financial hardship.

What activities are available and where? We have 1973 places across 157 sessions taking place across many of our towns and several of our villages.

Activities include football, swimming, horse riding, roller skating, arts and crafts, film making, science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) activities, family park cooking and more.

We recognise there may be a small number of pupils who are eligible and live in areas where there isn't provision. These families should have received a letter from their school or college telling them how to book onto the activities on offer in West Suffolk. If transport is an issue, Suffolk County Council may be able to help and if you receive a query relating to this, please ask them to contact **HAFenquiries@suffolk.gov.uk**

How do people book their place? Families with children in receipt of benefits related free school meals can book their

places now. Use the QR Code on the poster below. Schools are also being given information to help any parents who cannot access online to book.

Families not in receipt of free school dinners, but still in financial hardship should contact the activity provider in the first instance to find out how to apply for a place or places, or they can go to our dedicated web page at:

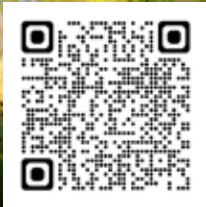

Calthorpe and Edwards Educational Foundation 2025/26

The Foundation helps young people from the parishes listed below with a grant for studies in Further Education. This means University, Further Education College, Medical School and similar establishments. It excludes courses that could have been obtained at School.

The Governors limit assistance initially for a maximum of three years and to no person over 25 years of age. The period may, at the Governors' discretion, be extended a year at a time when appropriate, but not beyond the age limit. The grant is paid in three termly instalments and for the year 2024/25 it was £336 pa.

Keith Boswell is the Chairman and Rosemary Boswell is currently the Clerk. All Governors who represent villages are volunteers and attend one meeting in September when new applicants are considered and the Clerk is given details of the new year's grant. Payment will be by BACS and students will be required to provide their home address, email address and bank details.

There are 2 groups of villages, the Inner Group and the Outer Group. If funds are limited, then students from the Inner Group take precedence.

Inner Group: Ampton, Ingham, Great and Little Livermere, Timworth.

Outer Group: Culford, Fornham St Genevieve, Fornham St Martin, Great Barton, Ixworth, Troston, West Stow, Wordwell.

Peter added that the election day starts at 5am and goes on to 2am and his role is to observe the elections and to not interfere or take part. His role is non political. Peter then described some of the ways that the voting system could be corrupted.

A fascinating talk on a difficult and delicate subject and there were many questions! We were pleased to welcome several visitors who came to enjoy Peter's talk.

Fornham Garden Club

In January, Fornham Garden Club members and guests enjoyed the club's annual dinner. A lovely evening with good food and an interesting quiz.

The February meeting welcomed Liz Long from Jubilee Farm, Great Barton to speak about how she and her husband Mike had journeyed into regenerative farming.

It was during lock down that they had researched soil health and what it would be like to eat only organically. They rent 16 acres and are 1 of only 2 of the 127 tenants of Suffolk County farms who farm organically.

Their aim is to produce local food for local people and are aiming to open a farm shop. They use regenerative methods which are - diversity, livestock integration, protection of soil surface minimising disturbance and maintaining living roots. This includes broad rotation, cover crops, no-till agriculture, all of which maintain soil integrity. The idea is that with healthy soil, there are healthy plants and animals, so therefore healthy people.

To date, the farm has hosted tree planting days, farm tours and launched a 'Veg Box' scheme. Two beekeepers have space also which helps with pollination, and there are also volunteers helping with the work.

Altogether an interesting and informative talk.

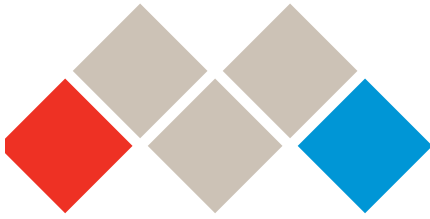
