more smiles per mile

In 2018 I wrote to the council about an idea I had to give free rides to people in Bury St Edmunds as I had come across many people who felt more isolated due to their poor mobility. Ann Williamson put me in touch with Libby Ranzetta who had a similar idea. We met in the February and by May we had our first rickshaw arrive. By contacting Local bike clubs we recruited volunteers to help provide the rides.

The plan was to run the service through the warmer months and shut down for winter. We had been so successful that residential sites made us realise that we could operate most of the year. In 2019 we started back in April and not only offered free rides to passengers but could help move food that would have gone to waste to charities like Bury Drop-in & Still Good Food.

We had gained enough support to apply for further funding from the town council and county council to purchase a cargo/wheelchair rickshaw. The new cargo bike was great when we adapted in the pandemic to offer prescription and food runs. Our volunteers went from 30 to 50 and as we were already set up we managed to go from offering 2 rides a day to 40 deliveries.

This service was only made possible by the very efficient volunteers who not only trained to ride our rickshaws but also took their own bikes out to collect essential items. We also registered as a charity and now have 7 trustees helping to comply with regulations for our charitable status. In 2020 we started to see the summer being back some normality which encouraged us to look forward at the new generation of rickshaws. All of the bikes have battery support (please don't say we are cheating as two people being peddled up a hill would not work without one)!

So 2021 has seen our opportunities to help people receive free meals made by college students, take people for vaccinations, blood tests, booster, along with our regular passenger rides. As restrictions have eased our valuable Chatty Chum Volunteers have returned to sit with someone on their ride to keep them company.

USAAF at Honington



Honington was assigned USAAF with designation Station 375 in June 1942.

The airfield was upgraded to a Class A Bomber base. In September, the VIII Air Service Command set up the 1st Strategic Air Depot Air Depot to service and the repair of B17s which was built to the west of the main airfield at Troston, specialising in B-17 models supporting the 3rd Bomb Division. Badly-damaged Fortresses were often instructed to crash land at Honington on return from operations if their landing gear could not be lowered, as this avoided the necessity to dismantle and transport the aircraft from its home base for repair.

Besides the air depot, Honington also housed an operational fighter unit when the 364th Fighter Group took up residence at Honington in February 1944. The 364th FG flew escort, dive-bombing, strafing (delivery of automatic weapons fire on ground targets) and patrol missions in France, Belgium, the Netherlands, and Germany. At first the group operated primarily as escort for B-17/B-24 Liberator heavy bombers.

The group patrolled the English Channel during the Normandy invasion in June 1944, while continuing escort operations & supported ground forces in France after the invasion by strafing and bombing locomotives, marshalling yards, bridges, barges, and other targets.

The group converted from P-38 Lightnings to P-51 Mustangs in the summer of 1944 and from then until the end of the war flew many long-range escort missions for the heavy bombers. The 364th received a Distinguished Unit Citation for an escort mission on 27 December 1944 when the group dispersed a large force of German fighters that attacked the bomber formation the group was escorting on a raid to Frankfurt.

The 364th also flew air-sea rescue missions, engaged in patrol activities, and continued to support ground forces as the battle line moved through France

and into Germany they took part in the effort to invade the Netherlands by air in September 1944; the Battle of the Bulge, December 1944-January 1945; and the assault across the Rhine, March 1945. The group converted from P-38 Lightnings to P-51 Mustangs in the summer of 1944 and from then until the end of the war flew many long range escort missions for the heavy bombers. The 364th received a Distinguished Unit Citation for an escort mission on 27 December 1944 when the group dispersed a large force of German fighters that attacked the bomber formation the group was escorting on a raid to Frankfurt.

The 364th also flew air-sea rescue missions, engaged in patrol activities, and continued to support ground forces as the battle line moved through France and into Germany they took part in the effort to invade the Netherlands by air in September 1944; the Battle of the Bulge, December 1944-January 1945; and the assault across the Rhine, March 1945.

Although the last mission by the 364th took place on 25 April 1945, the group did not depart until November. Even then, Honington remained the lone Eighth Air Force outpost in the UK becoming the USAAF Fighter Command HQ on October 5. Honington was the last USAAF station to be returned to the RAF.

By the beginning of 1946, the airfield remained the only active station of all the 122 which had been used by the Eighth Air Force

A fitting ceremony took place to mark its closure and official handing back to the Royal Air Force. On 26 February, Brigadier General Emil Kiel - the Eighth Fighter Command commander was present to hand over the keys of the station to Air Marshal Sir James Robb, AOC RAF Fighter Command. An RAF band played The Star-Spangled Banner as the Stars and Stripes were lowered for the RAF Ensign to be hoisted in its place.



We celebrated our 103rd birthday in traditional WI style with a beautiful cake made by our expert, Margaret Muttock, wine and Elderflower Fizz! Before the celebrations Joe Rudland an osteopath from Abbeyfields Clinic, came to tell us about Pain, Arthritis and Osteopathy.

Osteopathy was founded by Andrew Taylor Still, a physician and surgeon, in the USA around 1874. So its history is quite short. At the time Dr Still was practicing as a physician, he realised that traditional therapeutic regimes often caused more harm than good, as medicines commonly prescribed were arsenic and opium! Believing that a body wants to be healthy he investigated alternative treatments and eventually osteopathy was born. To become an osteopath in UK there is training for four to five years to attain a Masters degree, 1000 hours of clinical experience and the requirement to do CPD training each year, plus being registered with the General Osteopathic Council. Joe advised that appointments were 30 minutes long so he was able to have plenty of time with his patients, which helped to pick up other problems that were not obvious. Joe has special interest in acute low back pain, sports injuries and many others.

From November 2021 we will be meeting at 2.00 pm in the village hall on the second Tuesday of the month, so please come along, as visitors will receive a very warm welcome!




