From the Chair

Your Parish Council met last week, and as will be seen from the Minutes published elsewhere in this issue, we were thin on the ground. For the Council to be quorate we need a third of the Councillors to be present, a third of eight is two and one third, there were three of us so we just made it. Those not present all had legitimate reasons for their absence but we could certainly do with the current vacancy being filled. Anyone interested should contact any of the Councillors listed herein for further information.

This will be my last "From the Chair", I have been a Parish Councillor for ten years and have completed the term I set myself at the outset. I reluctantly took on the Chairmanship a year ago and now feel it is time for someone else to contribute to the future of the village. I will continue with my work for the Village Hall and the Community Centre but with other commitments outside of the Village I am retiring from the Council. I advised the Council of my decision at the recent meeting and will stand down at the next on 19th July. My decision does, unfortunately, create another vacancy.

This magazine is published by the Parish Council six times a year and is in need of someone who is able to compile it prior to going to the printer. The current compiling editor is retiring after a number of years in the job and is happy to help anyone willing to take on the position. While a volunteer would be the best solution it is possible that we could negotiate a suitable rate for a few days every couple of months. Please contact me if anyone is interested and able.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

Proposed and seconded that Cllr Paul Purnell be re-elected Chairman for the forthcoming year — all in favour.

APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Cllr Mat Stewart, Cllr Hugo Greer-Walker, Cllr Cathy Emerson, Cllr Don Lynch, County Councillor Rebecca Hopfensperger.

ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRMAN Proposed and seconded that Cllr Enid Gathercole be re-elected Vice-Chairman for the forthcoming year – all in favour.

DECLARATIONS OF INTERESTS

To receive disclosures of pecuniary and local non pecuniary interests for the agenda under discussion – none received.

To receive disclosures of hospitality exceeding £25 – none received. To consider requests for dispensations – none received.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the Parish Council meeting of Tuesday 15th March 2022 were unanimously approved and signed by the Chairman.

PUBLIC FORUM

No members of the public were present.

TO RECEIVE REPORTS FROM THE COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLOR Not available for the meeting.

TO RECEIVE REPORTS FROM PORTFOLIO HOLDERS

Cllr Don Lynch: Issues not yet resolved included the weight of traffic coming through the village, with Eastern Concrete being the most frequent;

indiscriminate issue of HGV exemption permits; speed and volume of traffic; the need for a safe pedestrian crossing

Cllr Hugo Greer-Walker: The TRO decision report for Tut Hill has been drafted, but unfortunately this has not yet been submitted to Senior SCC Officers for consideration. We are awaiting comments from the County Councillor to include in this (and another) report before they can be issued. This matter to be chased in the next week in an effort to progress the scheme.

Cllr Paul Purnell: To prevent rubbish being taken out by crows/foxes, the two small bins at the Community Centre are to be replaced with bigger lockable bins. Prices to be sought for approval at the next meeting. The play area report has not identified any urgent repairs, shackles on the swings are wearing, will be monitored and replaced if necessary, grass has been mowed and the broken fence repaired. Minor damage to the skate park, rivets on the trim have popped and need redrilling, small hole in side needs covering up, all to be monitored. A form of deterrent to prevent pigeons sitting on top of the swings to be purchased. Bench sited on The Green to be revarnished. Cllr Enid Gathercole: Spring flowers are looking good, all but two of the Lark Gate trees have taken, pruning will be required October/November this year. A few trees in the village need attention, the Community Centre grass has been cut and an excellent job done.

Cllr Jill Mayhew: The Rural Coffee Caravan will not be on The Green in June, but for those living in the bungalows, a get together with coffee and cake has been arranged. The Caravan will be back in July.

CLERK'S REPORT End of year financial reports completed for audit purposes. Other than items on the agenda, no further matters to report.

FINANCE MATTERS Payments made since the last meeting were approved, bank balances to date were noted and signed as correct by the Chairman POPLAR TREES ALIGNING THE GOLF COURSE ADJACENT TO THE B1106
A license to fell the unsafe poplar trees aligning the golf course has gone through, the logistics, i.e. road closure for carrying out the works, are in

hand. Cllr Mayhew to continue to liaise with the Golf Club.



DIALOGUE WITH HIGHWAYS AND EASTERN CONCRETE

Cllr Mayhew has written once more to Highways asking a) why are Eastern Concrete lorries continuing to come through the village b) who issues the permits c) do we have any consultation with peoples in the village or the Parish Council. Response expected within two weeks.

WAR MEMORIALS / WREATHS

Proposed by Cllr Purnell and seconded by Cllr Mayhew that wreaths laid at the war memorial are removed after one month – all in favour. To come into effect in November.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

It was agreed a firm quotation is necessary prior to any decision being made. If available, this will be discussed at the next meeting.

UPDATE ON JOINT COLLABORATIVE WORKING WITH SURROUNDING PARISH COUNCILS

No update available.

DOG POO SIGNAGE/BINS

Two additional dog poo bins to be requested from WSC. One to be located close to Thingoe Lodge, the second on the B1106 near to the River Lark bridge.

FENCING AT THE ALLOTMENTS / GRASS MOWING AT THE ALLOTMENTS

A new quotation to be obtained for allotment fencing. As the bottom half and possibly the top half of the allotments are mowed by plot holders, it was suggested the middle section could also be maintained in the same way. Cllr Gathercole to speak to the tenant who has previously offered to help out with the mowing.

CORRESPONDENCE

A letter was read out from the Thingoe Community thanking the Parish Council for their donation towards the cost of maintaining the gardens.

In April we welcomed Sarah Bullen from Still Good Food. A small charity in Bury St Edmunds, whose aim is to rescue surplus food (mainly from supermarkets and from donations) and redistribute it through their shops in Bury St Edmunds and Great Barton. We were horrified by the amount of food that is thrown away every day, eg 24 million slices of bread! The Charity helps to educate people so that they don't throw away perfectly good food, eg suggesting freezing bananas (1.4 million bananas are thrown away every day). Their shops are open to the general public and they ask a minimum donation of £1 for a bag of food. Larger donations are most welcome!! Sarah reminded us that food waste causes greenhouse gasses so therefore has an impact on the environment, plus of course, landfill. We certainly had our eyes opened.

At our March meeting, John and Gillian Grinham gave a fascinating presentation on their trip to the Holy Land in November 2019. Their guides were Rev Mark Hunt and his niece Dawn Hunt. Starting with a map of Israel at the time of Jesus, we were able to see all the places they visited, together with pictures of the areas today which are regarded as having special religious significance to Christians. Jerusalem is divided into four quarters, so it is important to many faiths, this they said they were very aware of. It is difficult to put into words how amazing it was to see and hear about places described in the Bible. From their photographs much of Israel looks very dry and the earth quite parched. So it was lovely to see images of the Sea of Galilee, the lowest fresh water lake in the world, and the surrounding area. John said that this was more than a trip, it was a pilgrimage. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the talk and it gave us much to discuss over refreshments!

Dealing with suspicious emails



What is phishing?

Phishing is when criminals attempt to trick people into doing 'the wrong thing', such as clicking a link to a dodgy website.

Phishing can be conducted via a text message, social media, or by phone, but the term 'phishing' is mainly used to describe attacks that arrive by email.

Criminals send phishing emails to **millions of people**, asking for sensitive information (like bank details), or containing links to bad websites. Some phishing emails may contain viruses disguised as harmless attachments, which are activated when opened.

Tell tale signs of phishing

Spotting a phishing email is becoming increasingly difficult, and even the most careful user can be tricked. Here are some tell tale signs that could indicate a phishing attempt.



Is the email addressed to you by name, or does it refer to 'valued customer', or 'friend' or 'colleague'? This can be a sign that the sender does not actually know you, and that it is part of a phishing scam.



Others will try and create officiallooking emails by including logos and graphics. Is the design (and quality) what you'd expect?



Does the email contain a veiled threat that asks you to act urgently? Be suspicious of words like 'send these details within 24 hours' or 'you have been a victim of crime, click here immediately'.



Look at the sender's name and email address. Does it sound legitimate, or is it trying to mimic someone you know?



Your bank (or any other official source) should never ask you to supply personal information in an email. If you need to check, call them directly.





A Good Neighbour Scheme is a voluntary initiative run by a group of local residents who want to help people in their locality to enjoy a better quality of life by offering them support with everyday tasks.
